
IRVINE CHILDREN'S FUND

The Irvine Children's Fund (ICF) was founded in May 1986 as a nonprofit partnership of volunteer business and community leaders dedicated to before and after school child care. ICF raises money to support facilities and programs for children attending before and after school child care programs operated by nonprofit providers on all 28 Irvine Unified School District elementary schools. ICF has continued to work to provide quality, accessible & affordable child care for children in transitional kindergarten through 6th grade. The child care programs are under the supervision of the Irvine Child Care Project.

The Irvine Children's Fund has raised nearly \$3M to meet these before and after school child care goals.

FUNDRAISING FOR

BEFORE AND AFTER SCHOOL CHILD CARE

In 1986, The Irvine Company donated \$250,000 to begin the fundraising campaign and donated an additional \$334,500.

In 2009, HOAG Hospital, the HOAG Foundation and the HOAG Community Benefit Program joined with ICF and have provided \$337,300 to fulfill our child care mission.

33 years ago, the Irvine Junior Games track and field meet was established as the major fundraising event of the Irvine Children's Fund. Festivities for this fundraising track and field event begin with an Opening Ceremony parade of 1,200 athletes from 34 schools marching into the stadium behind their school banners. Adapted PE athletes proudly march with their schools. Sponsors & dignitaries join the athletes for the lighting of the Irvine Junior Games flame that signals the beginning of a competitive and fun day of track and field events.

for Before and After School Child Care Scholarships & Programs

In 1988, ICF established a child care scholarship fund for low income, working families. The ICF before & after School Child Care Scholarship Program provides scholarships for children enrolled in Irvine Child Care Project (ICCP) supervised child care sites located on all IUSD elementary schools. ICF has provided child care scholarships totaling \$2,202,908. Provided 40,197 child care days and helped 1,722 children.

ICF has committed \$130,000 for before and after school child care scholarships this year.

FUNDS GRANTED TO THE CHILD CARE SITES & SCHOOLS

ICF has provided \$274,675 to 27 child care sites to enrich the programs with equipment, supplies and activities for all children. In August 2016, the child care program expanded to include the new Beacon Park school, August 2017 the 26th child care site opened at Eastwood Elementary and in August 2018, the 27th child care site opened at Cadence Park Elementary. The 28th child care site opened in August 2019 at Loma Ridge elementary school. Safe, accessible and affordable before and after school child care is a priority for all families.

In addition, ICF has provided \$242,292 to the schools and teachers participating in the Irvine Junior Games.

ICF has committed \$28,000 to enhance the programs at each child care site and \$13,000 to the schools and teachers participating in the Irvine Junior Games.

IRVINE CHILD CARE PROJECT

In 1984, the Irvine Child Care Project (ICCP) was established through a joint powers agreement between the City of Irvine and the Irvine Unified School District (IUSD). Under the direction of ICCP, child care sites are located on all 28 IUSD elementary school sites to provide before and after school child care for nearly 3,000 children in transitional kindergarten through sixth grade. ICCP selects and monitors the non-profit child care providers who operate the individual programs.

AWARDS

ICCP was chosen as a finalist for the National League of Cities Awards for Municipal Excellence in recognition of this exceptional public-private community partnership.

ICF was recognized by the Irvine Prevention Coalition and the Irvine Public Schools Foundation for the before and after school child care scholarship program.

CHILD CARE SITES

From 1984-2017, child care sites were established on 26 elementary schools in the Irvine Unified School District. In 2018, the 27th child care site opened at Cadence Park elementary school and in 2019, the 28th child care site opened at Loma Ridge elementary school. ICCP child care sites are now located on all IUSD elementary schools. In addition, modular buildings were added to increase child care spaces at Eastshore, Portola Springs and Stonegate. There are nearly 3,000 child care spaces to meet the growing need. Funds raised by ICF are used to continue to expand and improve before and after school child care on school sites for all children and to provide partial child care scholarships to low-income, working families to make these licensed programs accessible to families needing help.
